

29L District Governor Monthly Activity Contest – 2019-2020

SIGHT/HEARING SERVICES

1. Each eye exam/glasses provided –100 points
2. Each hearing exam/hearing aid(s) purchased -100 points
3. Each pair used eyeglasses/hearing aids (and turned in for reprocessing) – 10 points
4. Vision screening event – 500 points *

ENVIRONMENT

1. Adopt a Highway/Adopt a Spot/area cleanup – 500 points (max. twice yearly) *
2. Tree/flower planting project – 500 points (max. one time yearly) *
3. Community Clean Up project – 500 points (max. one time yearly) *

YOUTH: PEACE POSTER/RAP/QUEST/YOUTH EXCHANGE/OTHER

1. Any of the above projects or other youth specific project – 200 points *
2. Lions Club that sponsors new Leo Club – 1000 points
3. Leo Club/Lions Club joint project – date/description – 200 points *
4. Hosting Lions Youth Exchange Student – 1000 points
5. Club that sponsors a local student for Youth Exchange – 1000 points per student
6. Have a flag program at a local school. – 200 points (max. one time yearly per school, name schools)

COMMUNITY SERVICES

1. Aid to Elderly/Crime Prevention or Safety/Homelessness/Literacy/Recreation/Hosting an event to honor Community groups – 500 points (max. one time yearly for each category) *
2. Assisting another organization with a community project – 100 points *
3. Assisting another club with a community or Lions project – 100 points *

HEALTH CONCERNS/DIABETES/CHILDHOOD CANCERS

1. Diabetes Specific Projects – Screening/Education/Health Fair/Providing Medication; Equipment – 500 points *
2. Blood Donations/Health Education/Health Fair/ Childhood Cancer project– 500 points *
3. Strides Walk/ Relay for Life Project – 500 points

***Project must be a Lions club project. If aiding another organization, or performing a service, participants must identify as representatives of a Lions club.**

DONATIONS TO LIONS CAUSES AND OTHERS

1. Participation in Parade of Checks at District Conference – 100 points
2. Donations made to Lions projects – 100 points for each donation (individual member donations count as donation from club) (provide list)
3. Donations from club to local community projects/organizations – name project – 100 points (individual donations do not count)

SPECIAL EVENTS ATTENDANCE

1. Lions International Convention/ USA/Canada Leadership Forum/MD 29 Convention/ WV Lions Leadership Retreat/District 29L Conference – 500 points per Lion (names)
2. Visits to International Headquarters; Leader Dog; Pilot Dog; Paws for a Cause; WVU Eye Research Center, Morgantown – 200 points per Lion (names)
3. District Conference/Convention other than 29L – 200 points per Lion (names)
4. Zone meetings – President, 200 points; Secretary, 200 points; all others, 100 points per Lion.
5. Club hosting zone meeting – 200 points (one time yearly)
6. Cabinet Training/Club Officer Training – 200 points per Lion (names)
7. Participate in Zone, District, or Multiple District Project – 200 points per Lion (names and date)

CLUB RESPONSIBILITIES

1. 2019-20 Officer's report to LCI, First Vice District Governor, and 29L Secretary by April 30, 2019 --200 points
2. Payment of International Dues – 200 points (date) first half by 8/1; 2nd half by 2/1
3. Payment of MD 29 dues – 200 points (date) first half by 8/1; 2nd half by 2/1
4. Monthly Membership Report by last day of month reporting – 100 points
5. DG's Monthly Activity Contest Report by last day of month reporting – 100 points
6. International Activity Report by last day of month reporting – 100 points
7. Schedule with confirmation of District Governor's Visit by 12/31/19 - 100 points
8. Hosting District Governor's Visit – 500 points (date)
9. Having a club meeting program that features a District Chairperson – 500 points (date and chair)
10. Sponsoring a new Lions Club – 1000 points
11. Club Member serving as a Guiding Lion for another club – 1000 points
12. Having a membership drive using Global Membership Team – 1000 points
13. Have a net growth in membership. – 500 points each month your membership is higher than it was on July 1, 2019.
14. New Member Orientation – 500 points

HONORS

1. Naming Melvin Jones Fellow or Leonard Jarrett Fellow (new or progressive); Lion of the Year – 500 points

PUBLICITY

1. Publish/distribute Club Newsletter to all members (send copy) – 200 points
2. Article/photo in local paper describing a Lions project (enclose with report)-- 200 points
3. Submit a District Newsletter article about your club – 100 points
4. Article/photo featuring club project/club member in LIONS magazine – 500 points (date)
5. Project featured on TV or radio (date)-- 200 points
6. Club Facebook page or web page (active and updated) 200 points (monthly)
7. Lions Logo Sign displayed in community (photo) 200 points (yearly)
8. Erecting Lions billboard in community. (photo) 1000 points (yearly)
9. Distributing club brochures or flyers describing club project or fundraiser – 100 points (send copy)
10. Set up Lions Awareness Display at a major community function (fair, car show, festival ,etc.) – 200 points

FUNDRAISING

1. Club fundraiser – describe – 200 points (note amount of funds raised) (fundraisers occurring on more than one occasion during a calendar month can be counted only once during that month. Ex. Weekly bingo)

Visitation points will not be awarded if the visitation occurs at the same time as your own club meeting or other event.

For visits of 40 miles or more per round trip – points are doubled to 20. To qualify, write “40” on corner of visitation card.

All members of the same club may list their names on front of one visitation card.
